When a study is designed around a theoretical framework, the theory is the primary means in which the research problem is understood and investigated. Although theoretical frameworks tend to be used in quantitative studies, you will also see this approach in qualitative research.

Sample Theoretical Framework of a Dissertation or Thesis

A well-articulated and developed theoretical framework differentiates between a poorly and well-structured research writing (Alavi et al., 2018, p. 529). In addition, Alavi et al. (2018, p. 529) define a theory as a set of interrelated propositions and constructs that present a systematic view of the phenomenon being explored by specifying relationship among variables to envisage and explain such phenomenon.
