The present study provides information about suicidal thoughts in cancer patients based on psychooncological clinical experience in Japan. In the general population, several factors including sex (male), age (≥ 60 years), marital status (widowed or divorced), psychiatric disorder (depression or schizophrenia), substance abuse, and a history of suicide attempts indicate a vulnerability to suicide.
